

Day 1 - Upside down kingdom



There are four activities for today these are

1. Upside down kingdom find a word
2. Owl decoder
3. Pom pom owl
4. Kingdom crown & castle

For our youngest kingdom seekers 'pom pom owl' may require some adult assistance, however kingdom crown and castle should be suited to any age group (although assistance may be needed with cutting).

Family cooking - upside down pudding

For those that would like to do something extra as a family. What about an upside-down pudding? In this recipe you put all the batter ingredients in first and the sauce ingredients over the top and when it cooks it turns upside-down!

This ties in with our theme of today of God's upside-down kingdom. Jesus came into the world as our king and saviour, but He did not come to be served, but to serve and lay his life down for us by dying on the cross to take our punishment. This isn't how the world expects a king to behave! Talk about how different this is compared to worldly rulers.

Ingredients

Batter

- 1 cup self-raising flour
- ½ cup sugar
- ½ tsp salt
- 2 tbs butter
- ½ cup milk

Butterscotch sauce

- 2 tbs golden syrup
- 1 ½ cups hot water
- 1 tbs butter

Method

1. Pre-heat oven to 180°C
2. Grease an oven proof dish (approx. 20cm x 20cm)
3. Put self-raising flour, sugar and salt into a bowl.
4. Add butter and rub in with fingertips until well combined
5. Add milk and mix until a batter is formed, smooth batter so it is evenly spread across the bottom of the oven proof dish
6. Combine ingredients for butterscotch sauce in a separate jug
7. Pour butterscotch sauce over the top of the batter
8. Place in a medium oven (approx. 180°C) until golden brown on top
